Seniors – Planning Ahead Program

LUC received funding in 2024 from the Federal New Horizons for Seniors Grant Program to develop Seniors – Planning Ahead. The purpose of the program was to educate Seniors on topics related to death and dying so that they could confirm what plans they had in place and that they understood the importance of talking about their plans with their families.


The program has been offered four times since 2024 with a total of 126 seniors attending. Topics include wills & estate planning, powers of attorney, advance care planning, options for end of life care, estate taxes, role of the executor, funerals and grief and bereavement.

The next Seniors – Planning Ahead Program has been scheduled to run every Tuesday and Thursday beginning on February 24 to March 12, 2026. If you have any questions about the program or would like to be added to the waitlist, please contact Rhonda at 306-581-9057.

Due to the overwhelming positive response and interest in the Seniors – Planning Ahead program, we have applied for funding to continue offering the program in 2026 / 2027. We will not hear until February, 2026 if our grant application has been approved.

Study Group – You can still join our study group to learn about Brian McLaren's book 'Do I Stay Christian?' The first part of book says no and details some of the terrible things that have been done by Christians in the name of Christ. The next section says yes and provides reasons for remaining Christian. The final section provides some advice on how to remain Christian. We meet from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. in the chapel and on-line. Working through a couple of chapters each week, this study will take us to early May. The book is available through Indigo or Amazon but the latter takes 4 to 5 days for delivery.
